We hope that everyone had a restful break. Seeing more sunshine is something we can all appreciate! Over the break we had 18 Langley teachers give up four days of their break to attend the 2022 BCTF Annual General Meeting. While virtual meetings continue to be a challenge, our members and leadership continue to adapt and accomplish important business to move us forward.

At this meeting we welcomed our new President Elect, Clint Johnston. Clint is a former Chilliwack teacher and local president who has served the past three years as First Vice President and is currently bargaining chair for the provincial negotiations happening now. At the same time, our outgoing President, Teri Mooring was welcomed to the Past Presidents by previous BCTF President Glen Hansman. We are all grateful to Teri for her visible and steady leadership over these last three challenging years. (Full election results can be accessed at BCTF.ca)

Other important business discussed included discussions around Aboriginal Education, Health and Safety, Member fees, and Pension investments. (Full summaries are available at BCTF.ca) Of particular interest to Langley teachers was the successful passage of a motion put forward by our local reading as follows:

117. LANGLEY

That, to ensure members are partners in the integration of compassionate systems leadership (one of the three pillars of our provincial Mental Health in Schools Strategy) into BC public schools, the BCTF take steps including (but not limited to): 1. requesting that the Ministry of Education provide time and opportunity for BCTF members and staff to take part in the same four-day introductory training that was provided to other education partners (e.g., BCSSTA and BCPVPA members) in 2020–21.

2. investigating opportunities for the work of the BCTF, including meetings and training at the local and provincial levels, to incorporate a compassionate systems leadership lens.

President Tanya Kerr spoke effectively to the motion and it received strong support from members across the province. This is something that our district has provided to administrators thus far and includes structures and practices all staff can benefit from. We are hopeful that the passage of this motion will increase accessibility to all

The meeting closed with the optimism of hopefully meeting together in person soon and with the hopes of successful bargaining for an equitable deal that we so deserve. Thank-you again to all the LTA members who attended on our behalf.

Teacher Regulation Branch Annual Membership Fees

In April of each year, the Teacher Regulation Branch of the Ministry of Education, requires School Districts to deduct and remit the Annual Membership Fees on behalf of all current members of the Branch.



If you are paid by the District in the month of April, the deduction is mandatory for all active certified Teachers.

THE DUES WILL AUTOMATICALLY BE DEDUCTED FROM YOUR PAY, AND NO FURTHER ACTION IS REQUIRED FROM YOU.

Please do NOT remit the fees directly to the BCTRB. The BCTRB sends every member a reminder letter, however, please note that since we are mandated to deduct your annual fees, no follow up to that letter is necessary.

The deduction amount of \$80.00 will reflect on your April 29th earnings statement.

PLEASE NOTE THAT ALL TEACHERS ON A LEAVE OF ABSENCE AND/OR NOT IN RECEIPT OF SALARY FROM THE DISTRICT IN THE MONTH OF APRIL will need to submit payment directly to the Branch.
